She is committed to advancing the use of naturally dyed wool and felted artworks within the contemporary interior market, blending sustainability with artistic innovation.







BESPOKE DESIGN PROCESS

- 1. Initial consultation to discuss theme, design ideas and scale, colour pallete, interior focus, end materials and products.
- 2. Research and development: motif samples followed by consultations. There may be several before the final motifs are released.
- **3.** Fabric choices
- 4. Pattern development, colour, scale
- 5. Pattern repeats. Digital mock-ups
- 6. Final design
- 7. Preparation of files for samples: pattern scale and colour for digital print.
- 8. Design files sent to digital print company for fabric samples to check pattern, scale, and colour ways.
- 9. Review sample fabrics and finalise designs.
- 10. Print final fabric.



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
